Hopelands is taking over Parkrun!

Every Sunday at 9am, at the recreation ground on Oldends Lane, Stonehouse, there is a Junior Parkrun.

This involves children aged 4-14 running 2k in a non-competitive atmosphere – you run to challenge yourself, not others.

Adults are very welcome to run with their child but won't funnel into the finish with them, your child will have their moment of glory to themselves!

On the 9th June, the Friends of Hopelands would like to have a huge turn out from Hopelands School to reflect the ethos of the school: healthy living, fun and community spirit.

At every Parkrun there is a cafe where teas, coffees and cakes can be sold by a local group to raise money. On the 9th June, the Friends of Hopelands will be hosting the cafe. We hope to raise a lot of money which will go directly back into the school.

To join in all you have to do is register your child to Parkrun, which is completely free, and print out the barcode that you will receive and bring it along on the day. We have attached a handy help sheet to guide you through the process.

To register is free, to run is free and to park is free.

Several Hopelands students already participate each week and can vouch for how much fun it is!

Why not register and join in before the 9th to get prepared?!



How to register for Junior Parkrun

- 1. Go to http://www.parkrun.org.uk/stonehouse-juniors/
- 2. Click on 'Register' under 'What does it cost to join in?' Subheading.
- 3. Click on the 'Take me to the UK registration form' link at the bottom of the page.
- 4. Complete all the details in the form for your child but with your email address and click 'Check form'.
- 5. Click on 'Register me' at the bottom of the page.
- 6. Click on 'Barcodes'.
- 7. Click on 'Barcode' again.
- 8.Click on 'Click here to download your barcode'.
- 9. Print out your downloaded barcode you get 6.

10. Cut out one and bring it on the day and have it ready for the end of the run! Keep the rest as spares.

Note: Only the child taking part needs a barcode. Adults who are running with them won't funnel into the finish – only children allowed – and so won't need one.


Year 6
