Last week the year 6 children were invited to Rendcomb College for the day for a body percussion workshop. SIGNING IN AND OUT OF SCHOOL

I am afraid that I must, again, remind parent of the protocols when bringing children to school and collecting them at the end of the day.

Pupils must be brought in to school by the adult delivering them who must then either wait in the playground with them until lining-up time or deliver them to morning school care. This morning one of our staff watched as a pupil was allowed to get out of a car, parked on the opposite side of the road, and then cross the road unaccompanied to walk into school on her own. We have sent out a Disclaimer form to be signed by those of you who are happy to allow your children to remain unaccompanied (or not in supervised care) on the school premises in the morning but not many have been returned.

At the end of the day ALL pupils must be signed out of school.

If you are collecting a child (or children) at 3.30pm be advised that Years Reception, 1, 2 4 and 5 will be dismissed from the front of the school and Years 3 and 6 will be dismissed from the back. Younger siblings should be collected first, if possible, but ALL children must shake their teachers hand and will not be allowed to go until that teacher has seen the adult who is collecting them. Pupils should not run off to be with their brothers or sisters without being formally dismissed.

If you are collecting a child from an after-school club or care session please make sure that you always sign the register which is held by the Supervisors. Several times this week we have had reports from the after-school supervisors that children have been registered with them at 3.30pm but have not been signed out after leaving the club (activity or homework) which they then attended. This means our records show they are still on the premises at 5.30pm. Our main concern here is that, should the fire alarm ring it after a child has left, it is this record that will be used to determine who we believe is still on the school premises and we would not wish our staff to spend time searching the school for a child who is not here.
