Swimming

Swimming starts next Tuesday 10th September for the children in Year 1, 2 3 and 4. Dates of the swimming are on the Hopelands website calendar.

Pupils who wish to travel to Dursley Pool on the school coach must be here by 8.15am. As the school building will be locked please could we ask that all belongings that do not need to be taken to the pool (i.e. everything that isn't swimming related) is left on the veranda of the outdoor classroom (the little building that's behind the Sophie Hall). Those children who are being driven straight to the pool should be there by 8.50am. All children will return to school on the coach.

Please ensure you are on time as lessons need to start promptly, therefore the bus is unable to wait.

Morning and after school care

Both our morning school care (£3.75) and after school care (£7.15) sessions are offered on a flexible basis and no booking is necessary.

In the mornings Mrs Coles will be pleased to welcome your children any time from 7.45am and they will stay with her in the hall until it's time to line up at 8.30am. Children must be brought in by an adult please, using the back door to the hall.

Mrs Coles says "Morning school care is a time when the children are free to choose what they'd like to do (within reason!). We have board games and puzzles, colouring sheets and crayons and some soft toys to play with. Sometimes the children like to play active games with lots of running around, other times they prefer to sit and read - no two days are the same! We usually have a wide range of ages and we all have fun together before school starts."

In the afternoons, all children going to clubs or after school care line up to register with Mrs Coles and Miss Brown (the younger ones will be taken there by whoever teaches them last lesson). Once registered they are free to run around and play outside (or in the hall if it's wet) until 3.45pm when clubs (homework, cookery, dance etc) are called. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who are not doing a club stay in after school care with Mrs Coles and Miss Brown, children in Years 3 to 6 who are not doing a club go to homework club. Once the clubs are over, the children return to after school care to play.

It is vitally important that every child is signed out on the register by the adult collecting them. This is to ensure that all children are kept safe and accounted for at all times.

At the moment after school care is being held outside and the register for signing is on the decked area behind the hall - location will change when the weather changes, but there will be a note on the gate to advise you!

Please make sure your children are collected on time - collection after 5.30pm will incur a late fee.

Dance Club T shirts

If anyone would like to buy a Hopelands Dance Club T shirt, they are available for £12 each and usually take about a week from ordering.

Colour options are bright pink, turquoise, purple and cobalt blue, and sizes are S, M, L and XL (these are youth sizes). If you're interested, please see Mrs Charlie Coles who can show you the sizes.
