

I have spoken to Year 6 and we already have a team of eager volunteers. All Hopelands children are invited to attend with their parents and I will be there to lend my support, I will also be suitably dressed in 1940's style clothing to help the children feel they are not the only ones dressing up! Ribbons in hair, old style cardigans/fair isle jumpers and knee length shorts together with gas mask style boxes on lengths of string will be the order of the day.

I will bring old fashioned luggage labels for the children to have pinned to their jackets or coats. I do hope you will able to join us.

The parade will gather at the corner of Regent Street (near Pizza Planet) at 11.25 on Sunday November the 10th, and we will walk with other members of the community to the war memorial where our new Head Boy and Head Girl will lay the school poppy wreath. The minute of silence will be at 12 midday.


Comic Club
