NSPCC

Today we were visited by the team from the NSPCC. They gave interactive assemblies, one for the Key Stage 1 children and the other to Key Stage 2. They helped them identify a trusted adult they can talk to if they're ever worried about themselves or a friend. And they learnt about Childline, and how it can support them.

Afterwards the NSPCC team held a workshop with Years 5 and 6 and together they explored the topics in more detail using engaging exercises to look at different situations and decide what's OK and what's not OK.
