World Book Day – A message from Miss Porter

On Thursday 5th March it is World Book Day! This year, the theme of World Book Day will be detectives and spies. To celebrate, we will be hosting a range of literature related activities throughout the day and asking the children to come dressed up as their favourite detective or spy character. We will be asking the children to bring in £1 to dress up and the money will be collected and donated to our school charity. Costumes do not have to be elaborate as some characters such as Alex Rider or Ruby Redfort just need a prop or two alongside their normal clothes! The children can be as creative as they like when choosing their characters as some like Harry Potter, are known to solve mysteries even if they are not official detectives!

During the day, I shall be setting a literature detective competition around school for the different year groups.
