TO YEAR SIX ♥ ♥ ♥

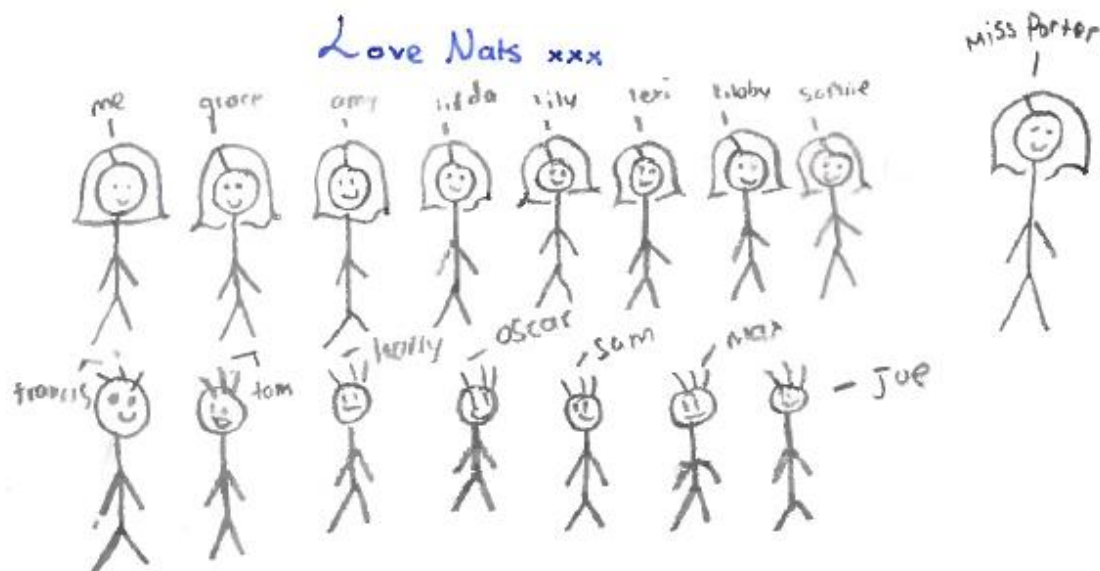
We've been together many years,
