Hopelands History

Hopelands was created from the vision of Mrs Murray-Browne in 1954. Married to the local Doctor and a mother of 4, she saw the need for an affordable local school which offered excellent education. Starting with just 15 pupils sat around their dining room table, the school was originally based at her house, The Mount, which is pictured below (building on the left). Years later the school moved into a building further up Regent Street and was renamed Hopelands.

We were delighted when a former pupil recently got in contact with us. John Tuffin attended the Mount from 1954-1956. He said it was a happy experience where he received a high standard of tuition and unlimited kindness. 
