


British Science Week by Mrs Boix

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 took inspiration from the Capulet ball in Romeo and Juliet and made masks to practise their French colours, animals and shapes.

Year 3 did some Shakespeare inspired colour and number work and took part in a 'Mission d'enquête' reading challenge to find out facts about Shakespeare.

Year 4 read different facts about Shakespeare in French to each other before swapping their cards. They used this information to answer personal information questions while pretending to be Shakespeare. They also looked at several lines from various plays and sonnets such as 'Rough winds do shake the darling buds of May' (sonnet 18) and decided which French weather phrases would match up to the lines. Year 4 were fantastic Shakespearean weather reporters!



Year 5 challenged themselves by successfully translating a French biography of Shakespeare into English. I was impressed at how they took on the role of language detectives, carefully looked at the language and deciphered the meaning of new vocabulary and structures.

Year 6 went on a fact-finding mission and filled out an ID card for Shakespeare. They also matched up French and English quotes from some of Shakespeare's works. Can you work out the quote below?
