

## Fire Service Visit – by Miss Hurley

EYFS and Year 2 were incredibly lucky to have a visit from Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Service. EYFS have been learning about people who help us, and Year 2 have been learning about The Great Fire of London. The firefighting education team were great at testing the children's Great Fire of London knowledge and even taught them some new and interesting facts.

The firefighters taught us to 'Get **Out**, Stay **Out** and Call the fire service **Out'** in response to fire. The children loved shouting the phrase at the top of their lungs! This really helped them to remember. Miss Hurley even tried on a firefighter's uniform, and we learned all about how important it is for firefighters to wear the correct materials and carry the right equipment to help keep them safe.

After a talk in the hall, we went outside to explore the fire engine! We sat where the firefighters sit when they go out on call, tried on their hats, and even got the opportunity to soak a few cars using the special powerful hose! They also blasted their sirens and shone the lights to see how they get attention of other drivers in an emergency. It was incredibly loud! Lots of EYFS had to cover their ears!

It really was an amazing visit! Thank you so much Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue and a huge thank you to Miss Cook for organising!

If your child is not entering the national competition but just wants to do the Hopelands competition, entries for that can also be on paper direct to me in Year 5.


The closing date for both competitions is Friday 11th March.

This year Miss Porter ran a competition for World Book Day where the challenge was to take a picture of themselves reading in an unusual place. All the entries were fantastic, well done everyone!













































## **Spiritual Arts Competition 2022 by Miss White**
