Both teams had to compete against other schools to try and win their case: The theft of an iPhone. The trials tested their ability to be interrogated under pressure and their ability to create a strong case/line of questioning to try to win their trial.

Year 6, Hannah, Martha, and Eva put in an amazing effort and both our teams won their cases which resulted in us coming 4th out of 16 schools and receiving the Celia Hargrave Sheild for best small school: an award which we haven't won since 2017! We are immensely proud of everyone who took part and helped prepare for the competition.

Year 2 have started a new block of learning about plants and British wildlife.

We started by considering the 7 key life processes that we learned about for animals back in the Autumn term. The children remembered all the life processes (growth, eating/drinking, taking in oxygen, reproduction, movement, getting rid of waste and reacting to the surroundings) even after six months! We had a discussion about plants and decided that, in their own way, plants do all these things too.

The children also carefully planted some bean seeds which we are going to monitor and measure over the next few weeks.
