The annual event involves the children being given an engineering challenge to complete in just over an hour. This year's challenge was to design and build a bridge, with a span of at least 30 cm, out of various materials but principally out of spaghetti. The bridge also had to be at least 15cm tall and was tested at the end to see how much weight it could hold. Hopelands' team worked together fantastically and built a beautiful bridge that easily held 1.5kg (and they felt potentially a lot more!) which was one of the highest loads tested. Congratulations to the team for doing an excellent job and making Hopelands proud.

Thanks also to all the other Year 6 pupils who were willing to give up their Saturday morning to represent Hopelands - you all are a credit to the school!

20th May - Cricket St Edwards v. Hopelands

As the sun gave way to the morning rain, our U8 and U9s travelled to St Edward's to play in what turned out to be a thrilling cricket match.

Beatrix lost the toss, and we were elected to field first. We started the bowling well with very few wides or no balls before Beatrix claimed the first wicket of the match with a run out in the 5th over. We had to wait until the 10th over for the next wicket as Finley bowled their batter, taking out middle stump. Gabriel and Megan also restricted the number of runs as St Ed's set us a target of 263.

Ava and Flo started off our batting, putting on a partnership of 16 before some lovely batting from Toby and Dylan with numerous quick singles. Alan and Auden helped us reach 238 before Megan and Bea weren't out meaning we were on 247 in the 8th over and going well. Arthur and Finley had listened to my advice and played some beautiful shots to get us up to 253 with 2 overs left. When Gabriel hit a 4, we thought we had the win. However, St Edward's managed to take a wicket with 4 balls remaining, losing us 5 runs in the process. Unfortunately, we couldn't get claw the runs back as we lost the match by an agonising 1 run!

25th May – Cricket Wycliffe v. Hopelands

On Wednesday 25th May, we took two U9 teams to Wycliffe to play cricket. The two words to describe the whole afternoon are 'power' and 'aggression.' All four sides (two from Hopelands and two from Wycliffe) managed to make contact with the bat on a similar number of occasions. However, Wycliffe, batted with more aggression which resulted in more boundaries.

I would like to congratulate Florence and Finley who both took wickets, and it was Florence, again, who manged to score a beautiful four. Gabriel listened to advice when coming into bat and connected well to score two fours but the target set, in both matches, was too high. The players are improving and it was frustrating we didn't capitalise on any balls down the leg side, having spent the morning practising our pull and hook shots. One Hopelands team managed to get 233 runs and the other one got 211 (starting on 200 and losing 5 runs for a wicket). This is also encouraging as all runs, in this match, were scored off the bat as any wides/no balls resulted in a free hit.

More importantly, I was very pleased with the behaviour of our pupils whilst fielding and waiting to bat and this is a credit to them. Cricket is a game where you may not be involved as much as other sports and staying alert, ready and focussed is crucial.
