We thought about what adaptation they would need, and we finished by drawing the habitat in which they live. The children loved the lesson and applied their science knowledge to the task. Teamwork makes the dream work! Y3 and Y4 worked together WONDERFULLY to create a rich and complex design on a paper kimono (that was actually bigger than many of the pupils!). Using traditional printmaking methods, they made their own printing plates, discussed composition and patterns, and represented their ideas with a fabulous sense of sharing and a common purpose. Ultimately, they all wanted to create a beautiful piece of artwork and they did!



### Maths by Mrs Elmore

What excitement for Year 6 on Wednesday opening an envelope to find a tube of Smarties! But alas, it was not simply a treat to eat. For their final maths lesson with Mrs Elmore, they had to estimate then count the number of smarties in their tube. Following that was an analysis of the colours (obviously recorded as fractions) illustrated using a tally and bar graph. Some children were very creative and demonstrated this using their concrete materials; other sorted their Smarties in height order as well as making symmetrical patterns. Well done Year 6!



### **Maths by Mrs Elmore**

Year 3 and 4 completed some memory training tasks on Wednesday. Developing teamwork, leadership and communication skills, the children worked incredibly hard to successfully recreate a picture of shapes and numbers by running to a specific point, looking at the picture, remembering an element of that picture then communicating it with their team to redraw the element. I was very impressed with the improved descriptive language, the adjustments made to teamwork and the turn-taking involved. Afterwards, the children reflected positively on their success and were able to articulate how they could improve if they were to repeat the task.
