The autumn term has begun very well indeed, and it was exciting and heart-warming to see all the little, and big, smiley faces in the playground on Tuesday. Everyone, staff and children alike, have returned happy and in good shape (apart from a couple of broken limbs) - ready for a vibrant new term.

This week has seen our launch of our new timetable and with that our new day structure. All staff and children have embarked on this new chapter with a team spirit that can only be described as second to none and as always, is quite unique to our school. They have been curious, asked many valid questions, adapted to the new, shorter lessons and just rolled with the new individual learning (IL) program. Our value for this term is TRUST. This is an important value in our school as it is an essential element to ensure successful learning can take place. It teaches children to be honest, kind, to follow important rules and to look after things and keep promises. A trust culture and meaningful relationships are essential for creating an atmosphere where children learn best and where all adults can do a good job. Building trust is a process, it doesn't happen overnight. This term, the children will see this value embedded in a number of activities throughout the term including assemblies and an increased focus in PSHE lessons. This is a good opportunity for us to thank you for the trust you place in us.




Year 2 by Miss Cook

Science by Mrs Stevenson

Year 3 got their 'Rocks and Soils' topic off to a practical start by investigating the characteristics of different rocks. The children worked independently to describe each rock and then test each sample to see whether they could scratch it, whether it absorbed water, whether it reacted with acid and whether it floated. We were amazed to find a rock that actually floats on water and learned that it was because of trapped bubbles of gas from erupting volcanoes!

As we got stuck in even more, everyone had a chance to explain how they would group the rocks into two or three different groups using higher order thinking skills to explain and justify their choices. A fantastic start to the term Year 3, I'm looking forward to continuing our science journey together!
