He is also attending summer rugby while the contact season is off. He has gained the nickname of 'tank buster' due to his knack of tackling boys a lot bigger and wider than him!



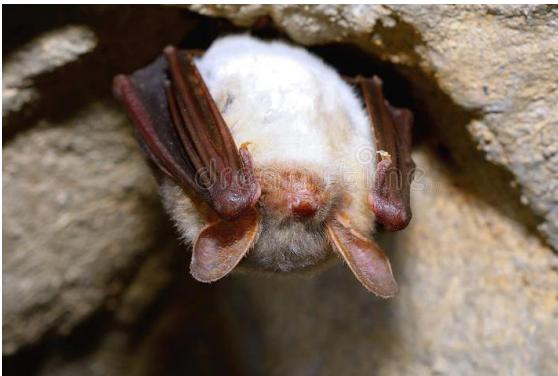
Scooter - thon
