Hopelands Preparatory School pupils sponsor toilets in Cambodia, Central Africa Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo, Guatemala, Liberia, Malawi, Pakistan and Uganda,

On Monday 6<sup>th</sup> February the pupils of Hopelands Preparatory School presented a huge, in every sense of the word, cheque to Carol and Harry Anderton of the charity Toilet Twining. Each year the school nominates a single charity on which to focus their efforts to raise money. This year's charity was chosen by the members of the School Council as being particularly worthy. The pupils' main efforts were concentrated on the Annual Christmas Fair, a lively and fun event which even the Mayor of Stonehouse attended. Beautiful hampers, home-made crafts and a day of dressing in silly Christmas jumpers raised enough money to fund ELEVEN toilets in all – £660. Mrs Barbara Sands, Head of PSHE, said 'I am so proud of our pupils at Hopelands. The lack of sanitary facilities in villages and camps is a serious problem which can cost lives and which should be so simple to resolve. The money they have raised will make a world of difference to so many people'.

For each toilet sponsored the school received a framed certificate to hang around the school – in the toilets, where else – which mentions the exact location of 'our' latrines.



## Morning School Care

Please be aware that morning school-care starts at **7.45am** each day. In order to keep all children safe and accounted for, we kindly ask that parents do **not** drop their children off before this time. This week alone there have been three instances of children being left unattended on school premises before 7.45am, and those staff who were already in school were unaware of their presence.

Parents must bring their children into the hall to ensure that they have been safely handed over to Mrs Coles and registered properly. We especially ask that parents do not just drop their children off on the pavement and ask them to walk in to school alone. Should anything happen to them staff would not know until the class registers are taken at 8.40am.

Morning school care is available every day from 7.45am until 8.30am at a cost of £3.25. No booking is required.
